Special Regulations for Section PF

- a. Dahlia Championship Classes are to be staged by 9.00am, Judging commences at 9.15 sharp
- b. Dahlia Championship exhibits is limited to ONE ENTRY per exhibitor
- c. Dahlias will be staged and judges according to the standards of the DAHLIA SOCIETY OF NSW & ACT
- d. Dahlias are to be staged with a combined stem and stalk of at least 160mm protruding from the vase for all types
- e. Dahlias over 160mm diameter are to be exhibited in one vase (X)
- f. Dahlias under 160mm diameter are to be exhibited three per vase (XXX)
- g. Dahlia exhibits must be named. If unknown "Name Wanted" or "Name Unknown" should be indicated
- h. A standard unit (horticultural tube) is a vase of one variety. A vase is any bottle or container suitable for staging dahlias. Champion awards will only be awarded to standard units.
- i. Distinct = different. NND = not necessarily different
- j. (X) means one bloom per vase, (XXX) means three blooms per vase
- k. Dahlia decorative classes may include formal, informal or semi-formal decorative types unless otherwise stated.
- l. Dahlia Cactus classes may include Cactus or Semi-cactus types unless otherwise stated
- m. Horticultural tubes will be provided for use in Classes 1-48
- n. Phone Entries WILL NOT be accepted

Special Regulations for the Decorative Section

- a. Exhibits must be the work of the Exhibitor
- b. Unless otherwise stated:
 - i. *Plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor
 - ii. *Exhibits may be in Oasis, Sand or Water
 - iii. *Any plant material may be used
 - iv. *Fresh plant material must be included in all exhibits
 - v. *Artificial flowers and foliage are not permitted
 - vi. *Exhibits will be judged from the front
- c. *Accessories may be used in all classes
- d. Definitions:
 - i. Accessories: Anything added to an arrangement to assist in the design.
- e. Design: The planned order of the elements according to the principles of design. A design may include one container or more and may include background or base.
 - i. Design Elements: Space, line form, pattern, texture, colour.
 - ii. Design Principles: Balance, dominance, contrast, rhythm, proportion, scale.
 - iii. Plant Material: Any part of cultivated, uncultivated and marine plants, fresh or dried.
- f. Arrangements to be staged by 9.00am Saturday 23rd March 2019.
- g. All exhibits are to remain benched until Sunday 24th March 2019.
- h. Exhibit collection times are Sunday 24th March 2019 from 4.00pm.
- i. The judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into. Entries will be judged according to the standards of the Horticultural Society of Canberra Inc.
- j. Entries close at the Show Office at 4.00pm Friday 22nd March 2019.
